Strengthening Families

All families can experience challenges related to parenting, illness, employment and income, substance use and/or the cycle of childhood adversity, mental health, abuse, and neglect. When families encounter struggles that are beyond their ability to manage, services that strengthen families and ensure the safety of children are critical.

KVC provides a broad continuum of care that creates a path toward hope and healing through crisis management, in-home therapy and skill-building, and connecting family needs with community resources. Our family preservation programs aim to help families remain safely together, divert children from entering foster care whenever safely possible, and improve family relationships.

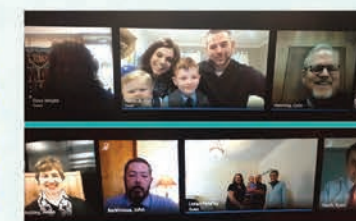

Foster Care

Foster care provides a safe, nurturing environment that gives a child's birth family an opportunity to resolve conflicts and learn healthy skills so the child can safely return home. **KVC recruits, trains and supports compassionate adults to serve as foster parents.** These individuals ensure that children receive the education, care and support they need to thrive, and play an important role in helping children recover from trauma and/or neglect they have experienced.

Moment of Impact

I've been a foster parent for a number of years now. I'm getting ready to adopt my 12 year old in about two weeks. A few nights ago, he was frustrated and said,

"Why doesn't anyone love me?"

I stayed calm and remembered my training. We talked through the facts that members of his birth family did love him. I reminded him of stories he'd told me and gifts he'd received — gifts he treasured. Just because someone wasn't able to care for him anymore didn't mean they didn't love him. And then I got to remind him that I loved him, too. I was going to go before a judge and declare just that, and more. I would promise not only to love him, but to care for his needs and prepare him for his future. Thankfully, **I was in a position to react in an appropriate manner and encourage him thanks to KVC.**

In-Home Therapeutic Support

In every community, families face challenges related to substance use, trauma, and physical or mental illness. **KVC works to stabilize and strengthen vulnerable families** by offering a full range of support services that are delivered by licensed clinicians right in families' homes. This eliminates the need to travel to an office, find child care or take time off from work, effectively eliminating barriers to treatment. **Every family deserves a bright future**, and working with families in their own homes offers a unique opportunity for our staff to identify teachable moments and introduce new skills in the location where change must occur.

KVC Institute

The KVC Institute provides professional development and education, clinical practice consultation and guidance, system design, Safe & Connected™ implementation, and research and evaluation.

Through a grant "Support for Legal Permanency and Adolescent Brain Science," the KVC Institute continued partnership with the Jim Casey Youth Opportunities Initiative of The Annie E. Casey Foundation. This thought partnership involved the KVC Institute serving in an advisory and consultative role on a committee established by the National Association for Social Workers (NASW) **to develop new adolescent brain curriculum for disseminating to 50 child welfare training academies.** Released in August 2020, NASW's curriculum focuses on translating expertise and best practices into content and tools that will provide child welfare and mental health practitioners, foster parents and other stakeholders information to better understand how the adolescent brain develops, and offer a brain and trauma-based lens for more effectively engaging older youth.

In another encouraging sign that the adolescent brain science innovations are having an impact, The American Bar Association has adopted new policy "The Adolescent Brain Research Toolkit" which KVC Institute also contributed thought partnership to developing.

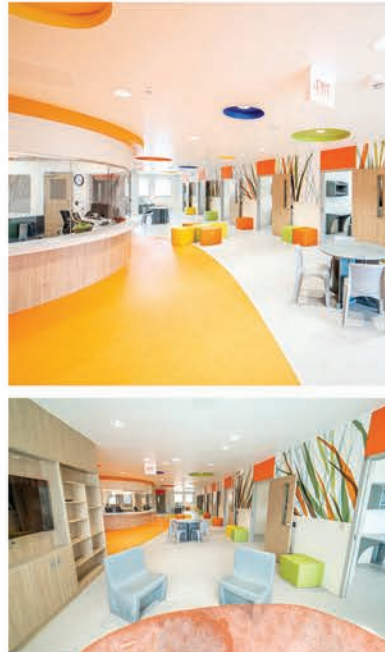

In addition to working alongside KVC offices, external agencies in Minnesota and Virginia and the country of Singapore received child welfare or health-related consultation.

Children's Psychiatric Hospitals & Residential Treatment Centers

Suicide is the second leading cause of death for people ages 10 to 34. The **COVID-19 pandemic has greatly increased depression and anxiety**, with the number of Americans reporting anxiety symptoms three times higher than it was last year. Our hospitals and treatment centers provide expert and compassionate care to those who are experiencing depression, anxiety, suicidal thoughts, impacts of trauma and other behavioral and mental health needs. The life-saving work done here is more critical now than ever before.

This year marked the **one year anniversary of our new hospital in Wichita, KS**. Made possible by generous donors and supporters, this treatment center allowed us to serve an additional 1,200 children and teens who required acute psychiatric care.

Moment of Impact

*"I'm having a flashback," his wavering voice admitted.
"It's playing like a movie on a loop in my head and won't stop."*

I listened as he told me about the pain. The abuse. The horrific night his biological father tried to drown his mother. The times he curled up in his room, willing himself to be invisible to his abusers.

My heart broke inside listening to the pain this young man had experienced. As a newly licensed clinician, I went to my clinical supervisor for help. His advice:

"Connection first...he needs a safe place."

After that, my first goal of every session was to provide safety and connection no matter the content shared. This client slowly began to trust and accept my help. We worked together and I listened when he shared that he didn't think anyone would care if he died.

During our work together, I saw him transform from living with nearly constant suicidal ideations and self-harming behaviors to a reduction in harmful behaviors, a bright affect and confidence to continue to make positive changes. **I learned that all the textbooks, theories, and interventions are nothing if it doesn't have a foundation of connection.** As a therapist, I am able to walk alongside these youth and meet them in their pain. Positive changes are born from trusting relationships. We all need connection.

1970

Founded as Wyandotte House
Created by the Junior League, the Ball family and other volunteers to help children who had been abused and were being housed in a juvenile detention center.

1991

Gold Seal of Accreditation & Children's Psychiatric Treatment Begins
Accredited by The Joint Commission, the gold standard in healthcare. **KVC Hospitals' children psychiatric treatment** began.



1995

Building a Proven Track Record
From 1980 to 1995, KVC grew to represent **one of the strongest child welfare and behavioral healthcare continuums of care in the nation** and adopted a philosophy of treating any child in need.

2000

Expansion into West Virginia
KVC initiated in-home therapy and child placing agency services **in the state of West Virginia.**



2004

Olathe, Kansas Headquarters Opened
KVC successfully completed a \$9 million campaign to construct a facility in Olathe, Kansas which serves as KVC's headquarters and houses the **Ball Conference Center.**



2009

Expansion into Nebraska and Kentucky
KVC initiated foster care/child placing agency, in-home therapy services and more in Nebraska and Kentucky.

2011

Adoption Celebration
KVC hit a milestone with 1,500 children's adoptions in 1,500 days.



2013

First Child Trauma Training Center Opened
KVC announced the **NYU/KVC Midwest Trauma Training Center** in collaboration with New York University and Dr. Glenn Saxe, Director of the NYU Child Study Center and founder of Trauma Systems Therapy

2015

KVC Institute Opened
Thanks to the generosity of many businesses, foundations, families and employees, the hub of the **KVC Institute for Health Systems Innovation**, called the KVC Sims Family Center, opened in Olathe, Kansas.

2019

Wichita, Kansas Hospital Opened
Thanks to generous philanthropic supporters, **KVC Hospitals Wichita** opened. Due to changes at all locations, **KVC Hospitals added 92 new psychiatric treatment beds for children in 2019-20.**

1996

Child Welfare Privatization in Kansas
The Kansas Department for Children and Families initiated the privatization of the state's child welfare services. KVC was selected as one of the first lead contractors.

2003

Renamed to KVC Behavioral HealthCare
To reflect the organization's national reach, Kaw Valley Center was renamed KVC Behavioral HealthCare.

2005

Adoption Services Began
KVC became responsible for helping children in foster care to be adopted into forever families in Kansas.



2008

National Recognition
The Annie E. Casey Foundation identified KVC for representing innovation and best practice approaches in child- and family-serving work. Parent organization, KVC Health Systems, is created to provide administrative services support to subsidiary organizations.

2010

Western Kansas Expansion
KVC Hospitals Hays opened to provide children's psychiatric treatment to youth in this rural and frontier area of the state.



In 2010, KVC honored 40 Heroes who supported and shaped the organization.

2012

Consulting for Washington, D.C.
Washington, D.C.'s Child and Family Services Agency hired KVC to provide consulting services, share best practices and **improve outcomes for children.**

2014

Consulting for Singapore
KVC began **providing consulting to the country of Singapore** in Southeast Asia.

2016

Leadership Transition and KVC Niles Expansion into Missouri
Jason Hooper became President/CEO. Niles joined the KVC family, offering day and residential treatment services to children and adolescents in the heart of Kansas City, Missouri.

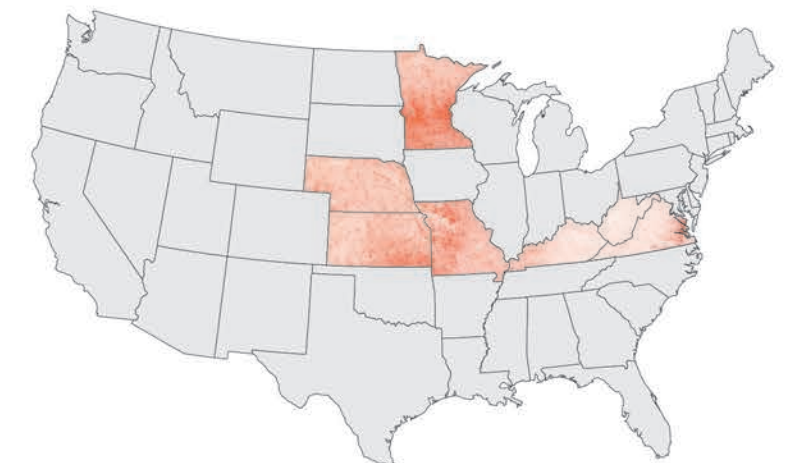

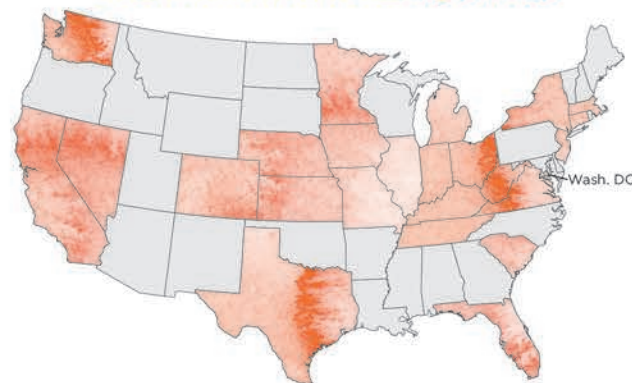

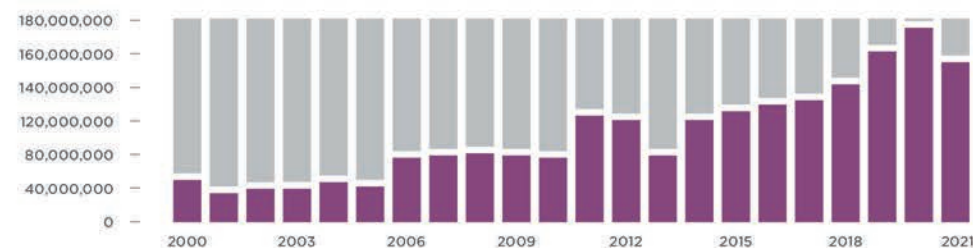

Operating Revenue

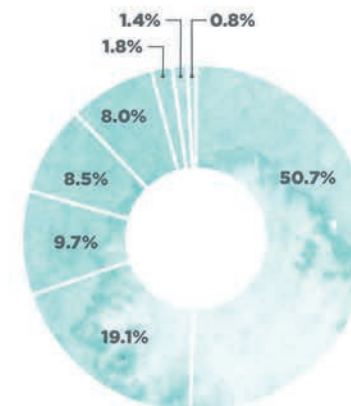


Operational Expenses
